Historical Background:

The Missions Offices have produced a number of publications over the years. These include: *Jesuit Missions*, *Jesuit Seminary News*, *New England Jesuit*, *Al Baghdadi*, *The Jesuit – New England Edition* and other newsletters, such as, *Jamaica Jottings*, *Jesuit Mission Bureau of New England Newsletter* and *Around the World with Jesuit Missionaries*. The Missions Office records related to publication of the *Al Baghdadi* and *The Jesuit – New England Edition* are included in this series. If the Archives receives any records related to other publications they will be added to this series. Issues of the publications are stored elsewhere, most often in RG 14 Publications or with the collection of the corresponding work or individual.

The *Al Baghdadi* was a newsletter about the Iraq Mission published irregularly from 1932 until 1966. The first issues were printed on shipboard while on route to Iraq. Later, material for the *Al Baghdadi* was sent to Boston and the newsletter was printed and distributed from Massachusetts.

The Jesuit follows *Jesuit Missions* magazine and the *Jesuit Seminary News* magazine. It was published as a cooperative venture of the Maryland, New Orleans, New York, Oregon, California, New England, Wisconsin, Chicago, and Detroit Provinces. Each Province had a regional page spread in each issue. The New England Edition was published from 1968 to 1983.

In November 1968, the New England Province loaned Fr. Clement Armitage to New York to take over editorship of *The Jesuit*. Each province retained a regional editor for its edition of *The Jesuit*. The editors for the New England Province were: Fr. Francis Anderson, 1968-1972; Fr. John Banks, 1973; Fr. Simon E. Smith, 1974-1975; Fr. Joseph O'Connor, 1976-1980; and Fr. Martin P. MacDonnell, 1980-1981. In 1980 the Jesuit Conference Board commissioned Fr. Donald R. Campion to identify "possible areas of unanswered need for communication internally as well as with outside publics" and his study included *The Jesuit*. The conclusion reached from the study revealed a national publication was needed rather than one more regionally based. *Company* magazine, which began publication in 1983, is the informal successor of *The Jesuit*.

Scope and Content:

This series contains the records of the Boston Missions Offices for the publication of the *Al Baghdadi* and *The Jesuit* magazine. It is divided into two sub-series, one for each publication. See more detailed information in each sub-series description.

Historical Background:

In February, 1932 two Jesuit priests were en route to Baghdad, Iraq to set up a high school. On board their ship, they composed and mimeographed one hundred fifty copies of a two page newsletter which was mailed back home to America when they landed. Two weeks later in Beirut, Syria [now Lebanon] a second, four pages long, issue was mailed. By 1936, this periodic newsletter, *Al-Baghdadi*, had a circulation of over four thousand.

“These men were deadly serious about what they were doing” in Iraq, Rev. Edward Madaras wrote, yet in their newsletter they “did not allow that seriousness to interfere with their sense of humor.” Pen and ink illustrations accompany the articles and the artist used broad caricatures, “the bulbous nose, the receding chin, the storm-tossed hair, the capacious paunch” to poke fun at himself and his fellow Jesuits in Baghdad.

This periodic newsletter was described as “a fitful, desultory journal published by the American Jesuits at Baghdad College as mood and circumstance permit, its purpose being to keep friends and the world in general informed as to our hopes, plans, aspirations, and achievements, and thus to promote and sustain interest in the project entrusted to us by Pius XI.” Soon after *Al-Baghdadi* began, subscribers wrote to the Jesuits in Iraq saying “they felt that they knew the Fathers personally, even though they had never met them.”

Scope and Content:

The collection contains some original pen and ink illustrations, copies to the printer, correspondence, and the source letters from Iraq used in the construction of the newsletter in its later years.

Historical Background:

At a meeting in 1965 in Buffalo NY, it was proposed that an inter-province cooperative magazine be published. Designed to replace the twelve variations of the New England *Jesuit Seminary News* issued by each individual Jesuit Seminary office in the U.S. Assistancy and Lower Canada, the new publication would encompass the seminary and mission offices set up in Buffalo, Maryland, New Orleans, New York, Oregon, California, Chicago, Detroit, Lower Canada, Missouri, New England, and Wisconsin. It was argued that a single magazine could be produced at the same cost as the twelve individual issues and a single editorial staff would save each province time and energy as twelve editorial staffs were currently being utilized. This, in turn, would produce a more universal publication in keeping with the spirit of the time and the Annuario. Only Oregon and New York accepted this proposal. *The Jesuit* began as a bi-monthly with the January/February issue of 1966 being the first. The combined circulation was 90,000 costing \$75.00 per thousand copies.

In December, 1967, the *Jesuit Missions* magazine ceased publication. At the Jesuit Missions Meeting in New Orleans in 1968 it was voted that *Jesuit Missions* should also give up fund raising and turn its mailing list over to the individual mission offices.

In June, 1968 the Provincials of Maryland and New York met with the seminary and mission directors and decided that *The Jesuit*, under the editorship of Fr. Furniss of the New York Province, should become the common magazine of the two Provinces with other Provinces invited to participate. With the increased circulation, the magazine was produced at \$60 per thousand with four issues a year.

All the Provinces, except Lower Canada and Missouri, joined the cooperative venture. The Fall and Winter issues went to the mailing lists of the seminary and mission bureaus of Maryland, New Orleans, New York, Oregon, California, New England, Wisconsin, Chicago, and Detroit. The circulation was 415,000 copies per issue.

In November 1968, the New England Province loaned Fr. Clement Armitage to New York to take over editorship of *The Jesuit*. Each province retained a regional editor for its edition of *The Jesuit*. The editors for the New England Province were: Fr. Francis Anderson, 1968-1972 ; Fr. John Banks, 1973; Fr. Simon E. Smith, 1974-1975 ; Fr. Joseph O'Connor, 1976-1980 ; and Fr. Martin P. MacDonnell, 1980-1981. In 1980 the Jesuit Conference Board commissioned Fr. Donald R. Campion to identify “possible areas of unanswered need for communication internally as well as with outside publics” and his study included *The Jesuit*. The conclusion reached from the study revealed a national publication was needed rather than one more regionally based. Soon after, the publication ceased production in 1982.
