Abstract: Saint Louis University (SLU) is a private, Jesuit, research university located in Saint Louis, Missouri. Established in 1818, SLU is the first institute of higher education founded west of the Mississippi River and the second oldest Jesuit university in the United States. The collection contains topic files, correspondence, publications, ledgers, journals, photographs, prints, and ephemera related to the history and administration of Saint Louis University from its acquisition by the Society of Jesus in 1829 to 2013. This collection was compiled from various sources by Province Archives Staff.

Processing history: Originally processed by Missouri Province Archives staff. Additional description completed by Alexandra M. Bisio in 2016.

Conditions governing access: This collection is open for research. Access to original glass plate negatives is limited to special appointments because the images are fragile.

Historical note

Saint Louis University (SLU) is a private, Jesuit, research university located in Saint Louis, Missouri. Established in 1818, SLU is the first institute of higher education founded west of the Mississippi River and the second oldest Jesuit university in the United States. Originally founded as Saint Louis Academy by the Catholic bishop of Louisiana, Reverend Louis William DuBourg, the Society of Jesus assumed control of the college in 1829. The university received a formal charter from the state of Missouri in 1832, and began offering graduate classes for religious the same year. By 1843, SLU had established the first medical and law programs west of the Mississippi and promoted professional as well as religious education. A place of many firsts, SLU founded the first schools of business, geophysics, and aviation west of the Mississippi. In 1867, the university purchased a tract of land at Grand and Lindell Boulevards, moving the campus from its original downtown location to the Midtown and Central West End neighborhoods of Saint Louis in 1888. Women were first admitted to SLU's graduate programs in 1908, though they would not be allowed to attend co-education classes as undergraduates until 1949. The school was racially integrated in 1944. In 1967, Saint Louis University became the first major Catholic university to give lay and clergy people the combined legal responsibility for institutional policy on its board of trustees.

Since the Society of Jesus accepted responsibility for the original Saint Louis Academy in 1829, Jesuits and Jesuit philosophy have been an integral part of education and campus life at Saint Louis University. The Jesuits of the Missouri Province, now Central and Southern Province, have been students, both undergraduate and graduate, as well as teachers, staff, and administrators. Saint Louis University is a separate administrative entity apart from the Province; however, the continued presence of members of the Province on campus has fostered a strong historical connection between the organizations.

Scope and content note

The Saint Louis University collection contains topic files, correspondence, publications, ledgers, journals, photographs, prints, and ephemera related to the history and administration of Saint Louis University from its acquisition by the Society of Jesus in 1829 to 2013. This collection was compiled from various sources by Province Archives Staff.

Topic files contain information on a variety of administrative topics, such as school policies, academic departments, professional schools, campus offices, centers, institutes, and associations. Files on university buildings, property and financial records, as well as attendance records, particularly those from the early twentieth century, are found in this series. Special events in SLU

history are also represented. Correspondence primarily consists of letters between various provincials of the Missouri Province and administrators at Saint Louis University sent between 1919 and 2005. Correspondence from the nineteenth century, included as “*varia*,” consists of letters regarding university financial matters and descriptions of the 1849 cholera epidemic in Saint Louis city.

Publications include lectures, course information, journals, magazines, newspapers, brochures, and guides created by and for members, and prospective members, of the Saint Louis University community. Ledgers and diaries primarily contains financial account books for Saint Louis University, Saint Francis Xavier (College) Church, and Saint Louis University High School. Diaries included in this series recount the education of Jesuit scholastics in the Theologate and contain poetry written by the theologians.

Photographs and prints include images of groups, individuals, events, and buildings. Late nineteenth and the early twentieth century glass plate negatives include subjects such as Jesuit groups, students, early campus buildings, and events. Ephemera consists of printed materials related to the history of SLU, including maps, diplomas, and playbills.

Scope and content note:

Topic files contain material dating from 1770, before the founding of Saint Louis University, to 2010. Files contain information on a variety of administrative topics, such as school policies, academic departments, professional schools, campus offices, centers, institutes, and associations. Files on university buildings, property and financial records, as well as attendance records, particularly those from the early twentieth century, are found in this series. Special events in SLU history are also represented. Topical files consist of reports, correspondence, memoranda, brochures and other promotional material, news clippings, meeting minutes, blueprints, and notes.
